What Is the Museum House?

FACT The Museum House is a 25-story, 295 foot-high, mega-condo tower that would be built in Newport Center on the Orange County Museum of Art (OCMA) site. Once approved, the **OCMA would move to Costa Mesa.**

Would the Museum House Impact Traffic?

FACT YES. The 25-story tower would **increase traffic and create more daily congestion in Newport Center and on already congested Jamboree and MacArthur arterial roadways.**

Why Is the Developer Trying to Block You from Voting On His Project?

FACT Thousands of residents contacted the Newport Beach City Council and voiced their opposition to the project. **Opponents believe it is too high, and too dense and will be the first step in turning Newport Beach into downtown Los Angeles.**
